NWSCC Zoom Board Meeting September 28th, 2020 PACRAT Racing Report

PACRAT board members are continuing dialog with the Mt Hood resorts and the resorts continue to indicate a desire to supporting PACRAT racing this season.

During our September 9th, PACRAT Board of Directors meeting, the following decisions were made regarding the upcoming season:

- Online registration for the upcoming PACRAT season will begin later in the fall due to the uncertainties of the season. We anticipate on-line registration to begin in mid-November.
- We will plan to push back the start of the PACRAT season due to the resorts implementing new
 protocols that may be in turmoil at the beginning of the season. With that, the first two on-hill
 events of the season will be cancelled:
 - Nastar Open race will be cancelled. Typically held in early January to assist with our new-racer recruiting efforts.
 - We will not begin the scheduled PACRAT races till the end of January. Typically we have two races in January, this year we will only have one. Thus we will truncate our season to only four races (usually five races are scheduled during a normal PACRAT season).

The PACRAT board is working on a budget to reflect these changes for this season, and what the registration fee will be for PACRAT 2021 season.
