The ski season went from zero base to an almost 150" base mid-mountain in less than a month!

January is [National Safety Month](#) at the National Ski Areas Association! This month is dedicated to promoting skier and rider responsibility and mountain safety. Resorts across the country participate every year to educate skiers and snowboarders about being safe and using common sense on the slopes. With that in mind, and especially with the massive amounts of snow we've received on the mountain this week, we want to reiterate that it's super important to practice [deep snow safety](#), both at the mountain and on your way up:

- Go to [TripCheck](#) and our [Conditions page](#) before heading up to Meadows
- Use chains or traction tires
- Keep a shovel in your vehicle in case you need to dig out at the end of the day/night
- Ride with a buddy and keep them in sight
- Carry avy gear (beacon, probe, and shovel) and know how to use them when heading into gated access terrain
- In case of an emergency, please call Ski Patrol at 503-438-3216 or contact any Meadows employee

If all this wintry weather has you wanting to skip the drive to Meadows, we've got good news for you: Columbia Area Transit's (CAT) Gorge-to-Mountain Express bus is scheduled to start service Saturday, January 8! This route runs from Hood River and stops at Odell, Parkdale, Teacup, and Meadows. The annual [GOrgE Pass](#) costs just \$40 for adults (\$20 for children 17 and under and Hood River Community ID holders) and gets you rides all season long on the Gorge-to-Mountain Express and other CAT routes. Head to the CAT website to learn more and to get your GOrgE Pass!

The Portland Park and Ride buses to Meadows are back this season! Picking up in three locations - Beaverton, Tualatin and Gateway - this is a great way to get to the mountain without having to drive yourself. The cost is \$35 round-trip; it needs to be purchased online in advance and masks are required on the bus at all times. Check the schedule and book your trip at [this link!](#)

With the new season and all the snow, we want to remind everyone of a few important items:

- * Lift tickets, lessons and rentals need to be purchased online in advance
- * Masks are required to enter our lodges and must be worn at all times unless you are actively eating or drinking in designated areas. They are also required at all times on our buses and shuttles
- * The roads to get here are snow covered and icy. Carry chains (and know how and where to put them on) or have traction tires, slow down and drive carefully
- * Use TripCheck before heading up to get traffic and road condition updates
- * And most of all, have fun!

There's another way to explore Meadows - by snowshoe! Starting January 8 and 9 we will be offering two tours every weekend to both Umbrella Falls and Sahalie Falls! Reserve your snowshoes and tour [HERE](#).

Our [Nordic Center](#) is open Thursday through Monday. Kick and glide through 15km of trails that will give you a great workout and awesome views. If you've never tried Nordic skiing that's ok! We offer lessons and rentals every day we are open.

We are bringing back our popular HRM early opening weekends and holidays! For those of you who want to get here early and start taking laps before our normal 9 AM opening time, park at the HRM lot where the lift will be turning at 8:30.

SUMMIT PASS: Timberline's Summit Pass (formerly known as Summit Ski Area) is officially part of the Timberline ski area as of October 1, 2021, increasing Timberline's vertical terrain to 4,540 feet, the longest in the United States. Located in Government

Camp, Oregon, the Summit Pass Lodge and base area offer affordable access to its beginner ski and snowboard terrain, as well as lessons, rentals, a restaurant and snow tubing area.

While this long vertical from Timberline to Summit Pass is not yet lift-serviced, it is accessible via other transportation methods and available when there is enough snow at all elevations. In the winter, skiers and snowboarders with a lift ticket or season pass can take the Timberline Resort Shuttle from Summit Pass in Government Camp up to Timberline. At Timberline, catch the Magic Mile Chair Lift up to the Palmer Snowcat access point to be taken to the top of Palmer. Enjoy the ride down to the Alpine Trail or West Leg Road, which ends at the bottom of Summit Pass.

The [Summit Season Pass](#) includes unlimited access at Summit Pass in Government Camp. In March, the Summit Pass upgrades to a Timberline Spring Pass, which is valid for unlimited skiing and riding throughout Timberline until May 30, 2022. Summit Passholders also receive 25% off daily lift tickets for themselves at Timberline.

Summit Pass lift tickets can be purchased upon arrival and are valid only at Timberline's beginner ski and snowboard area in Government Camp. These tickets may be upgraded at Guest Services for full access to all of Timberline's terrain.

Group discounts for 10 - 50 people at Summit can be arranged for Mondays - Fridays. Group bookings can be organized to include rentals ready upon arrival, meals, and lessons arranged so your group can hit the slopes immediately. Timberline Summit Pass can accommodate ski groups from 10 or more people. Review pricing options and get in touch with us by filling out the [Ski Groups Information Form](#) After submitting the form, the Group Sales Office will send you a link to log in and register your group. All participants need to submit their e-forms 72 hours prior to arrival. Lessons info is required 7 days in advance.

LESSONS Summit Pass is the best place on Mt. Hood to learn to ski and snowboard. The gentle slope and our experienced instructors make learning fun! Summit Pass group lessons are offered daily through winter break and then Fridays - Sundays for the remainder of the season. Summit Pass lessons are 2-hour group lessons, ages 6 and up. \$100 includes a Summit Pass lift ticket and rentals, or \$70 without rentals. Helmets are \$10 extra. Excerpts from Far West News Flash

BRUNDAGE TO ADD OVERNIGHT ACCOMODATIONS, NEW BASE LODGE, & MORE: Brundage Mountain's new ownership group, which acquired the resort in November 2020, has big plans over the next 10 years for new ski-in/ski-out accommodations, a revitalized base village, expanded lifts and terrain, and a plethora of new recreation and mountain amenities. Brundage will break ground next year on a new base area facility to be finished for winter 2023-24. The new 20,000-square-foot "mountain modern" lodge will be located next to the existing day lodge. It will include a new Mountain Adventure Center and three new food and beverage outlets, including an open-concept food court, a casual sit-down restaurant with full bar, and a coffee shop breakfast/lunch stop. The resort's master development plan includes proposals for lift and terrain expansion, expanded snowmaking capabilities, and new on-mountain lodge amenities.

WHAT TO EXPECT AT YOUR FAVORITE RESORT IN 2022: Resorts are beginning to open across the U.S. and Canada. After a year+ of COVID-19 rules and regulations, here are some things to consider for the coming season. Most U.S. ski destinations - including the big resorts in Colorado, Utah, Oregon, and California - are doing away with or easing last year's capacity limits on the slopes, mask requirements in lift lines, and spacing between skiers on lifts. But there are also some new [COVID-19 vaccination requirements](#) that people need to remain aware of. You don't want to be surprised by a ski experience that's too strict or too lax on COVID-19 safety measures for your liking: You may need to show proof of vaccination for some activities. Mask rules are likely to apply indoors only. You're less likely to need as many on-mountain reservations, however, for lodging ... **BOOK EARLY!** Booking early will pay off, especially when it comes to the cost of lodging. Lastly, if you can be flexible, avoid the weekends. Not only do they bring the most crowds, but lift tickets tend to be at their priciest.

TRIBAL-RUN SKI AREAS ARE THRIVING: Arizona's *Sunrise Park* is a 4-hour drive from Phoenix. Owned by the White Mountain Apache Tribe, the resort was named for the Sunrise dance ceremony, the four-day coming of age ceremony for Apache girls. Substantially larger than Snowbowl, *Sunrise* has 65 trails, which spread across neighboring Apache Peak and Cyclone Circle. They advertise 800 skiable acres, but it's more like 1,200. Another tribal-run ski area, run by the Mescalero Apache Tribe, is located in central New Mexico *Ski Apache*. The ski hill, originally called Sierra Blanca Ski Resort, was founded in 1961. It is not just a way to promote recreation and provide jobs, it's also a way to share culture, from traditional food to land use ethics. *Ski Apache* is the southernmost major ski resort in the United States.

FAR WEST MEMBER BENEFITS HAVE BEEN UPDATED: YOUR Member Benefits have been renewed for the coming 2021-2022 season, and can be found on the Far West website. We have added a new hotel in Mid Valley, Utah – *Crystal Inn & Suites*. We have a new "Adventure" Partner – *aha! Air, powered by Express Jet*. This is a commuter airline, flying non-stop into Reno, Nevada from a number of Oregon, Washington, and California Cities. Members receive 15% off on flights out of the listed airports. AND, our long-time shuttle service, *The Transportation Network*, out of Park City, has now expanded their service into the Reno/Tahoe area. The Snowmass base area has many new restaurants, lodging, and activities such as a climbing wall and ice rink. The *Alpine "Breath-taker" Mountain Coaster* now traverses the mountain slopes. FWSA INTERNATIONAL SKI WEEK: **Space Still Available, but you have to decide soon!!** *Solden, Austria* is the destination for the 2022 International Ski Week. Dates are **February 26 - March 5th** and will include 7 nights lodging at the 4-Star *Tyrolerhof Hotel*, including daily breakfast & dinner at the hotel. We'll be offering an optional day tour during the week if one chooses to explore the local culture. There will be an extension to the *Black Forest*, Germany, **March 5-11, 2022**. If one chooses to not go to *Solden*, but wants to do the *Black Forest*
