Mt. Hood SkiBowl is pleased to offer NWCC members a discount on lift tickets. \$29 will get you an open to close ticket (day/night). Just show your FWSA/NWSCC ID card at any ticket window at the mountain. One exception date: Sunday, February 18, 2007, when tickets will be \$38 for day ticket; \$41 for day/night ticket. PACRAT racers will receive their usual discount rate on race days.

FWSA Convention, May 31-June 3, 2007!

The Far West Racing Association has chosen Mt. Bachelor, Oregon, as the site of its 2007 Championships to be held March 30-April 1, 2007! See attached flier for lodging options. If you are planning a trip for your club to Mt. Bachelor, make it this weekend and join us

for a special party hosted by NWSCC to welcome all racers. PACRAT racers are automatically eligible as well! **PACRAT** has scheduled the final 2007 PACRAT race at Mt. Bachelor on Saturday, March 31, to make it easier for PACRAT racers to participate in this exciting event.

Plan early to qualify - you will need to race in 3 qualifying races this season before the championships. PACRAT racers are automatically eligible; with advance notice non-PACRAT racers may be allowed to ski the PACRAT courses for qualifying times; and there are several other local races to qualify, including the Skiyente sponsored Masters Race March 3-4, 2007. Please note that anyone in NWSCC who wants to participate in these championships (other than PACRAT racers) must keep in touch with Dale Parshall so he can track your qualifying races. SKI OREGON AND SKI WASHINGTON CHALLENGES: Back for its second year is the Ski Oregon Challenge. Ski 9 out of 11 ski areas in Oregon during the 2006-07 ski season and you could win equipment, services, or lift tickets for Oregon ski areas. Extra credit will be given for the 2 optional areas: Spout Springs & Warner Canyon.

NWSCC is expanding its Ski Challenge to the 14 ski areas in the State of Washington. To meet the Challenge you have to ski/ride at least 10 of these during the ski season. If you ski 10 of the 14 ski areas in Washington during the 2006-07 ski season you could win equipment, services or lift tickets for Washington ski areas. GUEST SPEAKERS, JANUARY MEETING:

Karen Norton of Mt. Hood SkiBowl and Collins Lake Resort spoke about the "family experience" that SkiBowl offers. By not putting the big dollars into upgrading the lifts to high speed quads, SkiBowl is able to offer families an extremely affordable and family friendly place to visit.

The mountain includes everything from beginner slopes on the lower mountain to challenging black diamond terrain in the Upper Bowl and Tom Dick Peak area. In addition, the Multorpor side has a snow tubing and adventure park, as well as sleigh rides. And in summer SkiBowl offers adventures galore, from the dual Alpine Slide to bungee jumping, in their Summer Action Park, with over 20 attractions! Lift tickets run from \$32 midweek to \$38 on weekends, with night skiing from 3:00 to closing for \$24. AAA members get a discount on night

skiing, and those who spend \$100 at Signal Sports (a sports shop catering to women, located in the Pearl) and show their receipt can get \$10 skiing on Tuesday nights, with free demos from Signal. Tuesday nights are regularly "Ladies' Night" with \$12 night tickets.

SkiBowl also offers meeting and conference facilities, and the ability to "rent a mountain" - groups can book the Cascade Chair and tubing hill on the Multorpor side, with a buffet. SkiBowl is the developer of the Collins Lake Resort in Government Camp, with upscale condos and townhomes can bе rented through www.collinslakeresortvacations.com and include passes for skiing or adventures at SkiBowl. 151 chalets have been completed; 48 units are being built in the "Lodge" phase, and approval has been granted for the Village Center which will break ground in 2008, offering 200 units ranging in size from 800 square feet to over 2,000 square feet. A free shuttle runs hourly to take guests around Government Camp and to SkiBowl and Multorpor. A proposed tram will eventually tie Collins Lake Resort to both SkiBowl and Timberline.

Want to stay in Government Camp on the cheap? SkiBowl also has a hostel with 30 beds for only \$20/night (bring your own bedding). Check it out at www.mthoodhostel.com.

New this year is the Fusion Pass, a seasons pass offering skiing at BOTH SkiBowl and Timberline for the winter season. What you may not know is that Fusion passholders don't have to drive up to the mountain if they don't want to brave the winter driving conditions - they can take a FREE shuttle that picks up in Sandy. Others can take that shuttle for a fee.

As part of our **SAFETY** theme for the meeting, our second guest speaker was **Christopher Campbell**, an OHSU PA student who spoke to us as part of their community outreach program. Christopher gave us a GREAT presentation on how helmets save lives - everyone should have one!

A general discussion on safety brought up many ideas. Skiyente promotes safety with articles in its newsletter and guest speakers at their meetings.

Emilio Trampuz has written many ski areas about how he would like to see ski areas promote TURNING instead of speed, suggesting that they set aside areas specially to teach people how to practice turning, possibly with orange cones, bamboo poles, or "whisker" poles. (Your editor was skiing at Mt. Hood Meadows on February 11 and found a special "skiers only" area on Two Bowl with whisker poles set to encourage the buildup of moguls - one thing that is guaranteed to make you turn!)

Mt. Hood Meadows is promoting "Space Not Speed," and is making speeders watch a safety video in order to be able to continue skiing at the resort. The person in front always has the right of way, and several recent accidents, including one fatality, have been caused by speeders crashing into the person in front of them.

The U.S. Outdoor Store recently did a great ad promoting helmets.

Even traveling in your vehicle can have safety issues - everyone was aware of what happened to the Kim family - and you should always carry food, water, and warm clothing in your car in the winter.

The Judge simply reviews these newsletters (about 4-6 of them) and completes a short score sheet. Websites to be judged will be sent to the Judge. The designated charity must "qualify" by providing proof to FWSA that it is a valid 501(c)(3) charitable organization in order to receive the funds. \$50 will be awarded to a qualified charity of choice for first place in each class, for Wentworth Outstanding publication and Outstanding Website. \$100 will be awarded to a qualified charity of choice for first place winners in each class, for Tollakson Outstanding Club of the Year.
